This week I've had the absolute joy of going into the classes at Gothic Mede Academy, for 10 fabulous Mindful Magic sessions!

What a wonderful school that wants to support their student's wellbeing, and invited me in as part of Children's Mental health week We are so incredibly lucky that this is our school in Arlesey!

Every class was introduced to what Mindfulness is (Being Present, Noticing and Acceptance) and we started to explore our different emotions. The main message of our sessions was to understand that every feeling we have is absolutely valid, important and OK!

The children started to relax their bodies and minds doing some mindful breathing with the 'breathe ball', listened to and engaged with the book 'The Colour Monster' by Anna Llenas, enjoyed some mindful movement and then spent some time crafting some beautiful Feelings Spinners

They were so thoughtful with these, choosing a different colour for each feeling -like in the book, thinking about the facial expressions we use to express our emotions, and also lots of children drew symbols and pictures to represent how it feels in our bodies, like butterflies in their tummies when nervous, fireworks for excitement and lightning for anger.

They were so pleased to use them to think about and show each other how they feel right now in the present moment

We ended with a lovely meditation, relaxing and imagining a rainbow of emotions, remembering each colour and feeling is important, and absolutely OK!




## Reading corner





Our Early Years team really get to know the children and lead activities that appeal to their interests. During lunch play yesterday, a group of Acorn children began collecting sticks with a view to making a house. They discovered this was a challenge and, with some discussion with the adult, it became a fire. They warmed their hands, being careful not to touch the fire and discussed how hot fires are. They then all found a stick and pretended to toast marshmallows and talked about what they taste like. This lead on to talking about s'mores which most children hadn't tried before so the adult led a role play pretending to make them. Some children then carried this learning forward by helping to make a tent for Acorn Class to camp in. They enjoyed their camp and were very careful of the night time animals! Just one example of how the children's interests lead to vocabulary rich discussion and learning opportunities.
