Thank you




Year two/three Hilary McKay's fairy tales

We have not asked for donations for the last few years due to COVID-19 and ALL the money raised from events goes back into the school, enabling the PFGM to provide items your kids use in school and paying for things such as our new library, coaches to swimming (Year 3) and Young Voices (Year 4), and sometimes subsidising school trips.
