The Year 3 classes very much enjoyed taking advantage of the autumn sunshine out on the school field this week as they developed their agility in PE.

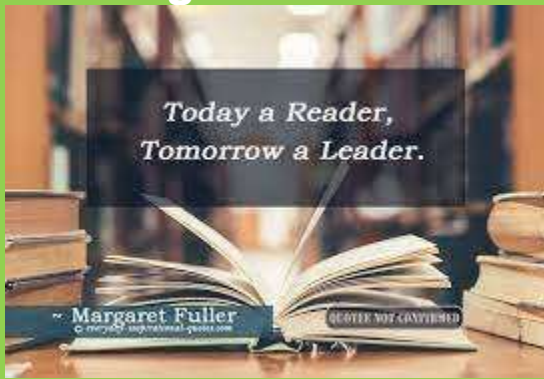


Year 4 play golf!

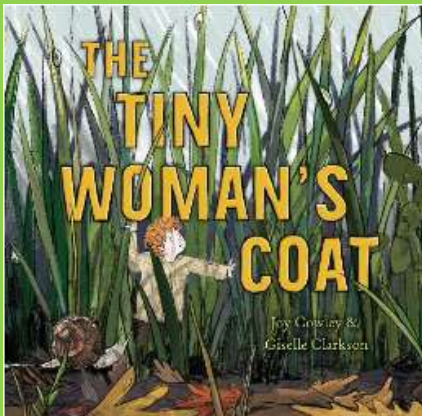


Reading Corner



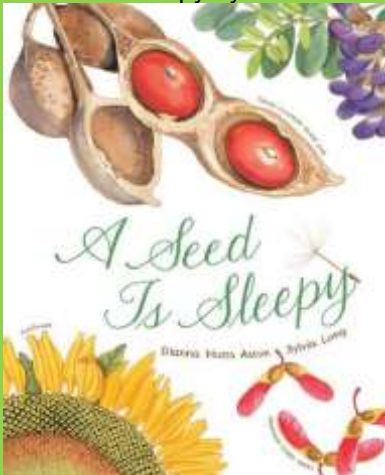
This week's book pics are on the theme of autumn. Why not go on an autumnal walk and see what inspiration you could find for writing?
