
This week, we are looking forward to talking to the children about their favourite Christmas gifts or winter holiday days out. We will be thinking about gratitude and saying thank you. We will be encouraging the children to add more detail in to their speech. For example; 'My toy dog was my favourite present because it is soft and I cuddle him in bed.'



From next week, the children will be working with the book Stick Man by Julia Donaldson. We will explore the outdoor classroom and the school field when we go on a stick hunt. While we are out and about, we will look for and talk about signs of winter. We will act out the story of Stickman and create our very own Stickmen and Stick Lady Loves using the sticks we have collected. We will also use the story to help us think about feelings and emotions, talking about Stickman and his family felt at different points in the story. We will link this to our work on 'Kipsy Caterpillar' and will encourage the children to tell us how they are feeling each day. We will also be talking about Stickman's family and use this as a basis for talking about the children's immediate families too. We will talk about how all families are different. If your child is able to talk about or recall/ recount the story of Stickman, please

Early Maths



Over the next couple of weeks in Maths, we will be learning about the number 3. We will sing 3 Blind Mice, read The Three Little Pigs and practise quickly showing 3 fingers. We will play lots of games that involve subitising which is being able to look at small group of objects/ dots etc and tell how many are there without having to count them. Please do share any observations of your child demonstrating their understanding of these areas on Tapestry.

Phonics

In Phonics we will continue with the theme of The Three Little Pigs. We will be using body percussion to make up and copy rhythms, listening carefully to sounds in the story, playing a game called Wolf's Rhyming Party where we will spot words that rhyme and making each other laugh by making lots of different animal sounds! Please do share any examples of your child hearing words that rhyme on Tapestry.

Observation focus of the fortnight:

Is your child becoming more independent about meeting their own care needs? Eg; can they wash and dry their own hands, can they brush their teeth (with support from you), talk about why it is important to keep clean? Can they make healthy food and drink choices and talk about which foods and drinks are healthy and which foods are treats?
