# 6<sup>th</sup> February 2024

The last couple of weeks have flown by! Last week, we had a focus on number and mathematical thinking. We focused on the number 4. We practised counting out 4 items, recognising the numeral 4 and playing a game where we had to decide if the quantity shown was four or not four. We then moved on to thinking about all the different ways we can make up 4 and sang 4 Little Speckled Frogs, thinking each time how many frogs were on the log and how many in the water. E.g 4 on the log, 0 in the water or 3 on the log and 1 in the water. The children enjoyed acting this out themselves in the tuff tray.

We also had a focus on shapes with 4 sides and talked about squares and rectangles. We used special square and rectagular shaped finders (like magnifying glasses) to helpus to find the squares and rectangles and sort them in to groups. We encouraged the children to explain how they knew it was a square (all the sides are the same length) or a rectangle (at this age they are looking for 2 short sides and 2 long sides). We looked for squares and rectangles in the environment all around us and found lots of examples – rectangular doors were



everywhere!

This week, we will begin to think about the number 5. Please do

In child initiated play this week, the children have shown a keen interest in bird spotting. Inspired by our sparrow visitor, we made binoculars in finger gym and the children have enjoyed using them to see if they can spot birds. We talked about how we need to be very quiet and still for the birds to come close, which, as you can imagine, is a big ask for a whole class of Nursery aged children. Maybe this is something you could do together at home. **Please do share this on Tapestry.** I am pleased to report that the fat balls made by the children have been eaten by the birds.



#### Phonics

In Phonics last week, we played a fun game called Noisy Fire Station. We looked at a large picture of a fire station and thought about all the things that would make a noise. We then had fun trying to recreate those noises using the instruments. We have also been listening out to the sounds that different words start with and played Time for Lunch. The children had to find the fire fighters all the food items beginning with a particular sound. I am really pleased with how the children are developing this skill (alliteration). It is one you can practise lots at home. E.g; I spy with my little eye, something beginning with m (don't forget to use the letter sound not name).
