Last week was Science Week and Acorn Class thoroughly enjoyed being scientists. We did daily experiements linked to changes over time. The children were fascinated by the adult led experiements and made lots of good observations. They particularly enjoyed looking at the ranibow colours produced during the skittles experiment and were interested to see the colours mixing together. The children then made some great suggestions about how an apple might change if we cut it open. One child thought that it might mean that the apple might sink in water if it was cut up so we tried it out and discovered that half an apple still floats! They were fascinated to see the flesh of the apple turn brown over the course of the day. We talked about how it is the oxygen in the air that is making it happen. We then covered one half of an apple in lemon juice and noticed that that stops it going brown. I was very impressed with how carefully the children looked and made observations.

We also did an experiment to see what made an ice cube melt most quickly out of salt, sugar, Mrs Godfrey's hands or a cup of warm water. The children predicted what they thought would melt it most quickly; many thinking it would be the sugar because it is sparkly. They were very excited to watch the 'melting race' and discovered that the warm water melted the ice most quickly followed by Mrs Godfrey's nice warm hands. We then had a dicussion about how warmth speeds up melting.

We also put some daffodils in to water coloured blue to illustrate that the flowers take up water. Unfortunately, this change took a very long time and there was only the faintest tinge of blue in the petals by the end of the week. Hopefully, we'll see something more impressive after the weekend. It did give us the opportunity to talk about how some changes are quick and how some changes take a long time.











Early Maths We have been learning all about the language of length and weight in class over the last couple of weeks. We have used the vocabulary; longer, taller, shorter, smaller, longest, tallest, shortestand heavier and lighter. We have been encouraging the children to use this vocabulary to compare everyday items. We have heard the children comparing their height, foot length, comparing their height to other objects, comparing the height of water bottles etc. We have used balance scales to compare the weight of the toy animals and set up a post office in class with some scales to compare the heavier and lighter parcels.

Please encouarge your child to use this vocabulary at home and compare the height, length and weight of different objects.

Show and Tell:
