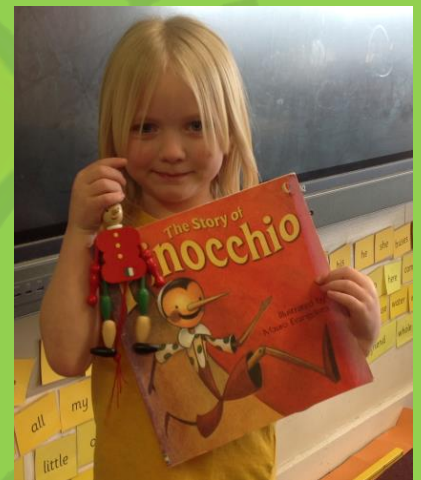
YEAR 4 ASSEMBLY
